Session Overviews

Session 1 Description: Teaching Units 3 through 5 with Focused Instruction and Assessments – Units 1 and 2 of the Course and Exam Descriptions allow teachers to assess and accelerate student learning. Units 3 through 5 build on this learning and further scaffold student progress in skill development. In this session, AP teachers will discuss how the next three units in the Course and Exam Description serve as a way for AP teachers to focus AP instruction on “required course content” while assessing student skills frequently to inform instruction.

Session 2 Description: Teaching Challenging Topics in Units 3 through 5 -- Each AP course has its tricky topics either in what resources to use or what ways are best to teach students a challenging concept. In this session, AP teachers will discuss specific challenging and/or tricky Topics in Units 3 through 5 of the Course and Exam Description and leave the session with details on how to address the tricky and the challenging.
